AND NOW, this 7th day of May, 2019, upon consideration of plaintiff's "Unopposed Motion for Preliminary Approval of the Proposed Class Action Settlement" ("motion"), the accompanying "Class Action Settlement Agreement" ("Settlement Agreement"), the accompanying "Class Action Settlement Notice" ("notice form"), which is attached to the settlement agreement as Exhibit B, the accompanying memorandum of law, and all other papers and proceedings herein, it is hereby

ORDERED

that the motion is **GRANTED** as follows:

 The following class is certified, pursuant to Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure 1708-1710, for the sole purpose of settlement:

All individuals who, during any time between April 10, 2015 and December 14, 2018, worked as a loan officer for defendant at its Wayne, Pennsylvania call center.

The law firms of Winebrake & Santillo, LLC and the Law Office of Chris R.
 Miltenberger, LLC shall serve as class counsel and, as such, shall represent the interests of plaintiff and all class members throughout future proceedings.

- 3. Plaintiff Patrick Hackman is appointed class representative of the class defined in paragraph 1 above.
- 4. The proposed settlement, as described in the Settlement Agreement, is

 PRELIMINARILY APPROVED, subject to further submissions and further findings at
 the fairness hearing described in paragraph 8 below. The parties have until fourteen (14)
 days prior to the fairness hearing to file any papers in support of the final approval of the
 settlement and until seven (7) days prior to the fairness hearing to file papers in response
 to any objections to the settlement. In addition, class counsel shall have fourteen (14)
 days prior to the fairness hearing to file all papers in support of their request for the
 payment of attorney's fees and litigation expenses from the settlement fund.
- 5. The Notice Form attached to this order is approved as to form and content and shall be distributed to class members in the manner described in the Settlement Agreement.
- 6. Any requests for exclusion from the settlement must be post-marked no later than fortynine (49) days after the mailing of the notice by class counsel.
- 7. Any objections to the settlement must be post-marked no later than forty-nine (49) days after the mailing of the notice by class counsel.
- 8. A fairness hearing will be conducted on September 9, 2019, in courtroom 650,

 Philadelphia City Hall at 11 am. During the fairness hearing, the court will consider the
 parties' arguments in favor of final approval of the settlement, any objections, and will
 hear argument from individuals who wish to be heard.
